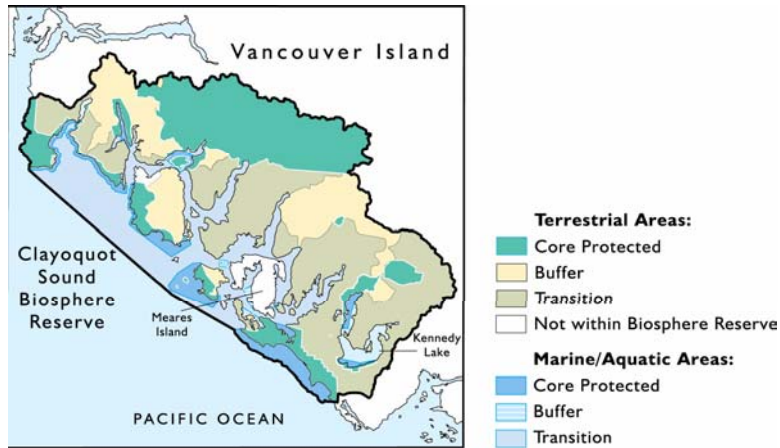
INTRODUCTION

The Clayoquot Sound UNESCO Biosphere Reserve

In January of 2000, with the support of local First Nations, local communities, and each of the local, provincial and federal governments, UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation) designated Clayoquot Sound as a World Biosphere Reserve (Clayoquot Sound UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, CSUBR) under UNESCO's Man and Biosphere (MAB) program. Internationally, there are 480 Biosphere Reserves, 13 of which are located in Canada. Biosphere Reserves are internationally recognised for promoting and demonstrating a balance between people and nature. They combine the three functions of conservation, sustainable development, and logistic support (for research, education and training). All Reserves have legally protected core areas which give long-term protection to landscapes and ecosystems, buffer zones where activities are organised so they help support the conservation objectives of the core areas, and zones of co-operation or transition areas where people work together to use the areas resources in a sustainable manner.

The CSUBR Region includes both land and marine components, totalling approximately 350,000 hectares, 110,000 hectares are core protected areas comprised of parks and ecological reserves. The Reserve extends from Esowista Peninsula in the south to just north of Estevan Point.

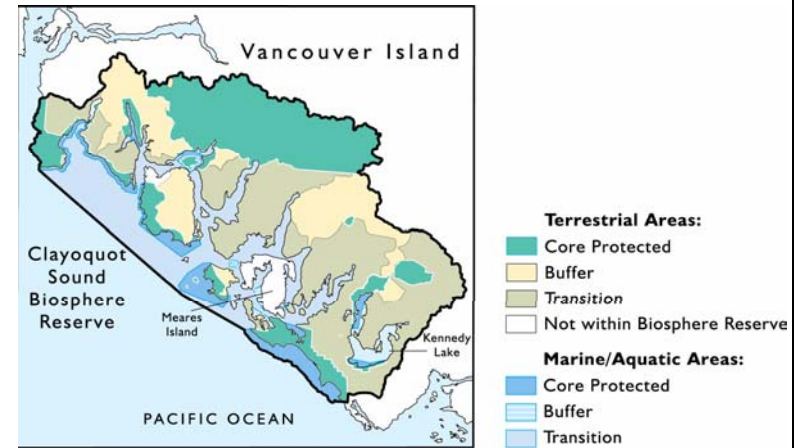
The Clayoquot Biosphere Trust (CBT), a federally registered, non-profit, charitable organisation, is the administrative arm for the \$12 million grant from the Government of Canada. The local Nuu-chah-nulth First Nations and local communities directly govern the CBT through a board of directors. Using the income from the endowment, the CBT supports local research, education and training that supports and promotes both conservation and sustainable development in the Biosphere Reserve Region.
